- (1) THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING WERE READ AND APPROVED AS WRITTEN.

- 1. 6/21 Email request to Port attorney to push for an Illahee Store acquisition by Illahee Day...
- 2. 6/23 Date of approved "Workplan to Conduct a PLIA Preliminary Planning Assessment" document, received from Dan Hatch, describing plans to conduct contamination drilling and assessment, has been loaded on the website.
- 3. 6/26 Utility Locate at Illahee: Email from Dan Hatch noting "...our private utility locating company will be out next Monday, June 26th to do their work. This will/may include scoping drain lines, ground-penetrating radar, and toning to identify subsurface utilities in order to mark their inferred location on the surface. The markings on the surface will then be used by the survey to develop a site as-built, which will then be used by the architect to create a site plan." The locate was reported on in an Illahee Community Update on 6/28/17.

- 4. 7/3 Email from Anna Jordan "I wanted to update you on our proposed drilling schedule for the former Illahee Foods property in Bremerton. We are scheduled to be on Site with our drillers Wednesday, July 12th. We are planning to be on site at 8 a.m., however, the start time may be pushed back a little depending on the drillers' schedule. I should have a better estimate of that at the end of next Monday, and I'll keep you updated. We've estimated that the drilling will take two days. The drillers will have a truck-mounted drill rig and a service truck on site. Also, Washington state regulations require investigation-derived waste (IDW) to be stored on-site pending laboratory analysis of their contents. We estimate there will be approximately 10 drums (55-gallon) of IDW that will need to be left on site for one to two weeks. Can we arrange a space to temporarily accommodate these drums?"
- 5. 7/9 & 7/11 Reports of dock users falling through loose boards. Frequent dock user Nick Hughes, who also last year with a friend hammered down all the loose nails on the dock, fell through a loose board that had one end move laterally off its support. We lifted the board up and moved it back in place. On Tuesday afternoon I received a call of a woman falling through a hole created when another board moved laterally off its support. The board fell into the water and hopefully was retrieved later. I installed a plywood cover over the hole as a temporary fix. Nick Hughes and friend offered to help secure the decking that is contracting and warping with the dry and warm conditions. My recommendation is we take out the nails that are working their way out and replace them with deck screws.
